INTRODUCTION

Welcome to Crankworx Whistler!

This Technical Guide covers the relevant rules and procedures for the Elite and U19 categories for the RockShox Canadian Open DH / Canada Cup event held on August 14, 2022.

In case of a divergence between the information found within this Technical Guide and information concerning these events found anywhere else (e.g. the internet), this Technical Guide shall be considered correct.

The 2022 Mountain Bike Canada Cup Series Rules also form an integral part of this document; they should be consulted together with this Technical Guide. The procedures within that document applicable to all 2022 Canada Cup events shall apply to the RockShox Canadian Open DH event. The 2022 Canada Cup Series Rules are available <u>HERE</u>.

SANCTIONING

The RockShox Canadian Open DH / Canada Cup event is sanctioned as a Class 1 event.

By registering for this event, racers agree to follow and be bound by the rules and procedures outlined in the Technical Guide, and also agree to follow the rules of the International Cycling Union (UCI), Cycling Canada, and Cycling British Columbia. Likewise, the policies, rules and procedures of the Whistler Mountain Bike Park apply when participating on Whistler Blackcomb property.

The Canada Cup DH event is sanctioned by Cycling Canada, Cycling BC and the International Cycling Union. The rules of the UCI shall apply.

*U19 & Elite Categories will be combined for UCI Points & Elite Prize Money. Separate podiums will be held for U19 & Elite categories **Minimum age 13 [year of birth 2009].

***Minimum age 15 [year of birth 2007].

Race Category Eligibility (Age and Gender) for all Crankworx events will be determined by the athlete's UCI license or Cycling BC provisional license. For athletes who do not possess a UCI license, and do not require one for any of the races in which they are entered, Race Category Eligibility (Age and Gender) will be determined by the athlete's Birth Certificate or Passport. Athletes may be required to provide evidence at athlete registration or accreditation (at the discretion of the Athlete Manager or Event Director).

REGISTRATION

Advance online registration mandatory - no onsite registration will be offered.

Entry Fees: Elite & U19: \$115.50 CAD (including 5% GST) U15, U17, Senior, Masters, Veteran: \$94.50 CAD (including 5% GST) Whistler Blackcomb lift tickets are not included in entry fees.

Refund Policy:

Entry fees are refundable (less processing fee) providing cancellation notice is received in writing to athletes@crankworx.com by the registration deadline. Registration deadline is August 2 at 23:59 PDT. All entries are non-refundable or transferable after the registration deadline (even in the case of injury or mechanical problems).

Lift tickets and passes

Discounted lift tickets will be available in the Athlete Centre for race and training days. Must be purchased at the Aava at the same time that racers collect their race plate. Race day \$29 +tax. Training \$67 +tax (Adult 19+) / \$61 +tax (Youth 13-18).

Lift Line Priority

Racers registered in the Canadian Open DH will have priority loading on the Fitzsimmons Chair for training (August 12 & 13) and on race day (August 14).

RACE LICENSES

All competitors in the RockShox Canadian Open DH will require a 2022 race license.

The Elite and U19 categories are sanctioned by the UCI as a C1 race. A UCI license is required to race in the Elite and U19 categories.

The U15, U17, Senior, Master and Veteran categories are sanctioned by Cycling BC. Either a Cycling BC or UCI-affiliated Cycling Federation license (example: USA Cycling, Cycling NZ etc.) is required to race in the U15, U17, Senior, Master or Veteran categories. Competitors in these categories will need to purchase a one-event license through Cycling BC as part of the Canadian Open DH registration if they do not have a race license and confirm they have sufficient medical coverage. It will be an add-on through online registration. One-event license fees are outlined above in the 'Entry Fee' section.

License check for riders competing in the Elite and U19 categories:

*Please note license checks are mandatory. For competitors who have checked in and collected their race plate prior to Thursday August 11, will need to come back to have their UCI license checked by the Race Secretary.

RACE FORMAT

Crankworx Downhill races will use a Seeding Run + Finals for UCI Elite and Finals only format for other categories.

Start order / seeding for the Elite categories and U19 will be based on a combination of UCI ranking, Canada Cup ranking and Crankworx World Tour DH Series rankings.

TRAINING

There is a mandatory training requirement for the event. Minimum 2 training runs must be completed during the August 12-13 training sessions and verified by a commissaire. Riders who have not completed the training runs during the August 12-13 training sessions won't be allowed to start in Finals or the Seeding Run.

Riders must start all training runs at the official start gate.

SEEDING RUN

Seeding Runs are for the Elite Men and Elite Women categories only.

Seeding Runs are mandatory. If a rider does not start for the seeding run, they will not be placed in the start list to race in finals on Sunday August 14, 2022.

Start order for finals for the Elite Men and Elite Women categories will be determined by the results of Saturday's Seeding Runs.

UCI PRIZE MONEY & POINTS

UCI points and prize money shall be awarded for Elite Men^{*} & Elite Women^{*} categories as per the UCI Regulations for Class 1 (DHI) International events; likewise, the competitions for these categories will be conducted under the UCI regulations.

*Note: For International Class 1, 2, 3 and DH events, U19 (17-18) riders are considered to be Elite for the purposes of races. Even though separate U19 Men and U19 Women categories and podiums are held for the RockShox Canadian Open race and DH Canada Cup series, the results are combined with those of the Elite category before they are sent to the UCI. Also, the prize money scale is likewise combined. So, for example, if the 3rd place rider in the combined results is a U19 racer, then that rider will receive 3rd place Elite prize money and 3rd place UCI points.



COURSE INFORMATION

Start Elevation: 1019m (3346ft) | Finish Elevation: 660m (2165ft) | Vertical Drop: 359m (1181ft)

Start with Joyride, exit to the left and proceed towards the lift tower that is just below the Schleyer drop, continue down the Fitzsimmons Chair lift line, cross Old Olly Road, remain on Fitz Chair lift line to reconnect with Joyride, continue to rock face, cross the Mountain Road below 1.0 mileage marker over the road gap, across the flats to new section (adjacent to the Slopestyle course) to the finish.

Notice: Racers in the MEN | U15 and WOMEN | U15 categories will be required to ride around 3 features. First Ride Around: the hip/rock drop under the Fitzsimmons Chair, Second Ride Around: the road gap feature across the Mountain Road, and Second Ride Around: the final finish step down jump feature.

RULES

By registering for this event, racers agree to follow and be bound by the rules and procedures outlined in the Technical Guide, and also agree to follow the rules of the International Cycling Union (UCI), Cycling Canada and Crankworx Whistler.Likewise, the policies, rules and procedures of the Whistler Mountain Bike Park apply when participating on Whistler Blackcomb Property.

RACE PLATES

Only riders with race plates will be permitted on course during official training. Altering, cutting or placing of unauthorized sponsors' logos on race plate will result in a fine and/or disqualification. This includes writing on the race plate with a marker.

ALCOHOL

Any racer caught drinking alcohol during the race will be disqualified from the race. Riders may also be suspended from further Crankworx Whistler competition and may face further penalties on the Crankworx World Tour.

COURSE ETIQUETTE

A rider must act in a sporting manner at all times and must permit any faster rider to overtake without obstructing.

RE-ENTERING COURSE

If a rider exits the course for any reason, he/she must return to the course at the same point from which he/she exited.

RE-RUNS

Re-runs, when a rider is permitted to do an additional timed run, will only be granted for those riders who are already on course when a medical or other course hold occurs. These riders must report to the Chief Commissaire at the finish line to request the re-run. Re-runs will not be granted to faster riders blocked by slower riders. Slower riders are expected to yield to faster riders.

MISSED OR LATE STARTS

Racers arriving late for their scheduled start should report to the Start Commissaire who will determine <u>if</u> the racer will be permitted to start at a later time.

TIMING CLAIMS

Claims concerning the result or conduct of an event must be made within 15 minutes of the unofficial announcement of the result of the event (or category) to the Commissaire at the finish. If no claim is made, the results become official.

RIDER PROTECTION

Full face helmet with peak mandatory for all riders. Gloves, elbow and knee protection mandatory for riders in the U15 categories,
