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CANMORE MTB CLASSIC – 2025 CONTINENTAL SERIES – EVENT DESCRIPTION

The Canadian stop on the inaugural UCI Continental Series XCO event is at the Canmore Nordic Centre from June 11 to 14, 2025. These days will consist of the following races:

1. UCI XCO #1 C1 Race – Wednesday June 11, 2025
2. UCI XCC C3 and Provincial XCC Races – Thursday June 12, 2025
3. UCI XCO #2 CS Junior Series Race and Provincial XCO – Saturday, June 14, 2025

This event is hosted in partnership between Cycling Canada, the Alberta Bicycle Association, and the Alberta Nationals Mountain Bike Race Association. The races are taking place at the Canmore Nordic Centre which has purpose-built mountain bike trails and facilities designed to host racing events. The Canada Cup series is designed to provide competitive opportunities to the next generation of cyclists, transitioning from provincial race series to national/international competitions. The Continental Series is a new initiative from the UCI and provides opportunity to transition to World Cup competition.

For ease of review of the Tech Guide, items in red generally refer to UCI Sanctioned events while blue refers to Provincial related events.

EVENT RULES/LICENSES

[UCI regulations](#) and [CC-specific regulations](#) will be enforced for all Canada Cup Categories. The [Alberta Bicycle Association \(ABA\) specific regulations](#) will be enforced for all other categories.

REGISTRATION

UCI Canada Cup and Continental Series XCC & XCO Races

- All riders competing in UCI Sanctioned categories must have a valid UCI license.
- All participants attending from out-of-country must possess a valid UCI license from their country of residence.
- Holders of UCI international licenses that do not bear a photograph will be required to present an approved and valid government photo ID in addition to their UCI license.
- If the international license does not provide the same designation of the race category being entered (ex. Elite), proof that the designation is equivalent must be provided.
- Any rider from outside of Canada or the USA is required to present a letter of permission from their National Federation to race in Canada and a letter demonstrating that they have adequate and valid liability insurance to race in Canada.
- There will be no "One-Day" Licence issued for UCI Sanctioned categories.
- U17 Expert and U19 Junior riders must possess a UCI Racing License with the "Expert" ability designation, or an equivalent designation in their issuing province/territory/country.

Provincial XCC & XCO Race

All riders competing in the Provincial categories must have a valid UCI license, have a Provincial/Citizen Race License, or purchase a day license for the race. Day licenses cannot be issued to a non-resident of Canada; all non-residents must have a UCI License to compete in Provincial categories. A maximum of 3 “day licenses” can be purchased by a racer in the year. After the 3rd day license, a full UCI license is required. A day license can be purchased for an additional \$20 per race during on-line registration.

Provincial Categories aged 17 and older will be ability based (as per ABA) rather than age based and will be Novice, Sport, and Expert Men and Open Women.

UCI Junior Series Category

Please see the below entry criteria for the UCI Junior Series event, as mandated by the UCI. The full UCI Junior Series Criteria can be found [here](#).

Canadian-licensed riders	<p>Riders who possess a license issued in Canada will need to meet the following criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Must hold a UCI Junior License, with the “Expert” ability designation
Non-Canadian Licensed riders	<p>Riders licensed outside of Canada will need to meet the following criteria, as mandated by the UCI:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Must hold a UCI Junior License; – Must have at least 20 UCI points (for riders in Europe) or 1 UCI point (for riders outside of Europe) in the latest UCI XCO individual junior ranking; or, – Must have been entered by their National Federation (maximum of 5 supplementary riders per category) – Riders belonging to a UCI elite MTB team or a UCI MTB team

RACE PACKAGE PICK-UP

Package pick-up will be available at the registration office on June 10 to 13 (see schedule). Race packages can be picked up by the rider or a representative; however, **the rider’s UCI license must be presented to pick up the package**. If the package is being picked up by a representative, they must have a valid UCI license. See the full schedule for Race Office hours of operation.

The course will be open to registered competitors and coaches only for official training during designated official training times listed below. Race plates will be required for all competitors riding the course during official training.

Notes:

1. Laps and Race Distances to be confirmed by the UCI Chief Commissaire. Details to be provided during the Team/Rider Meeting on June 10 for XCO #1 and June 12 for XCC and XCO CS.
2. The starting order for each race will be in chronological order as listed above. All XCC starts will occur at the same time.
3. For the XCO's, depending on registration numbers, some categories may be combined. Otherwise, there will be a time gap between starts for the XCO.
4. Total registration numbers may affect the format and times for XCC races. High numbers may result in separating combined starts and adjusting a start time to a slightly later start, or other strategies. Low numbers may result in combining categories and altering of start times.
5. It is the responsibility of riders to keep track of lap numbers completed during their race.

RIDER CALL UP

Rider call-ups will follow the order set forth by the UCI and Canada Cup Regulations. (See below.)

U17 (CC)

1. Top 16 of the current Canada Cup Ranking
2. Random order by plate number distributed

Junior (CC)

1. Top 16 of the current Canada Cup Ranking
2. Random order by plate number distributed

Junior (Junior Series)

1. As per the most recently published UCI XCO juniors individual ranking of the current season (or the final ranking of the previous season if no ranking has yet been published for the current season).
 >> All riders with UCI points, regardless of how they have been registered or have met the entry criteria.
2. Unclassified riders by rotation:

The start order of the riders within the team must be confirmed by the teams during the rider's confirmation. The start order among the teams is determined as follows:

- First, national teams whose order is determined by the nations' classification of the concerned category from the most recent world championships.
- Second, unclassified national teams whose order is determined by drawing lots.
- Third, UCI Elite Mountain Bike teams whose order is determined by the most recent team ranking.
- Last, UCI Mountain Bike teams whose order is determined by the most recent team ranking.

The teams (in the order as mentioned above) are taken in turn with the teams' first riders starting in sequence, then the teams' second riders etc.

3. Unclassified riders team B of the national federation of the organizing country: drawing lots.

Junior (UCI)

1. All riders on the current UCI ranking
2. Top 16 of the current Canada Cup Ranking
3. Random order by plate number distributed

U23/Elite (W/F & M/H)

1. All riders on the current UCI ranking
2. All riders on the current Canada Cup Ranking
3. Random order by plate number distributed

The Canmore Nordic Centre Provincial Park is located within a 90-minute drive of Calgary's International Airport and is just a five-minute drive from Canmore. It offers a variety of recreational activities including cross country skiing, biking, hiking, disk golf and orienteering. Host site of the 1988 Olympic Winter Games Nordic events, the Canmore Nordic Centre continues to host regional, national and international events year-round.

The Canmore Nordic Centre is located in an area that is home to many species of wildlife including bears. **When recreating in bear country, your best strategy to avoid an encounter with a bear is to make lots of noise, stay in groups and be alert for signs of bears. In the rare case of an aggressive confrontation, bear spray is your best defense.**

It is recommended that riders carry bear spray during official and unofficial training rides and the information and video at the following link be reviewed prior to riding at the Canmore Nordic Centre. [Bear Spray — Biosphere Institute of the Bow Valley](#)



The requirement to carry bear spray during the races will be dictated by Alberta Parks officials and will be disclosed at the Team Manager's meetings on June 10 and 12.

Kananaskis Conservation Passes

Alberta Forestry and Parks have instituted a new parking pass requirement for the Canmore Nordic Centre. 

- Dual Sided Feed/Tech Zone (Twice per Lap)


UCI Canmore MTB Classic XCO #1 and CS Start Loop: Elite, Junior and U17 Expert
