2026 ESPORTS WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS SELECTION POLICY

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All programming subject to change.



SECTION A – GENERAL INFORMATION

This document lays out the criteria to be used for selection to the Canadian team for the 2026 UCI Esports World Championships Semifinals, where athletes can earn spots for the 2026 UCI Esports World Championships.

The Semifinal will be held virtually on Oct. 2, 2026, and is limited to approximately 130 riders per gender.

The top 16 riders per gender from the Semifinal will be invited to attend the World Championships person in one of two hubs, one in Europe and one in North America, on Dec. 12, 2026. Flights and accommodation for the world championships will be paid by MyWhoosh.

Canada has been awarded a quota of 3 women and 3 men for the Semifinal; athletes will be awarded these positions using the specific criteria in Section C.

Additionally, athletes can also qualify through public qualifier events hosted by the UCI on MyWhoosh on Sept. 5 and Sept. 12. The top 20 athletes per gender on Sept. 5 and the top 10 on Sept. 12 will qualify for the Semifinal.

Cycling Canada will provide riders selected to the Semifinal (either using one of Canada's quota spots or through the public qualifier events) with administrative support, invitations to any preparation rides and events that Cycling Canada will host, and a National Team jersey and bib shorts to be worn during the Semifinal and, if they qualify, the World Championships.

At the conclusion of the Semifinal, MyWhoosh and the UCI will conduct performance verification and will then issue individual invitations to riders who qualify to the World Championships.

Athletes must meet the Eligibility Criteria in Section B to be considered for selection.

Selection decisions are based on the Specific Criteria in Section C.

Unless expressly stated in the Specific Selection Criteria, selections are subject the General Selection Policy found on the Cycling Canada website.



SECTION B – ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible for selection to the Canadian team, an athlete must:

- Be a Canadian citizen.
- Have a valid Canadian passport that does not expire before the date required by the consular authorities of the country in which the event is being held.
- Be in compliance with all relevant CC, UCI and MyWhoosh requirements for eligibility and performance verification.
- Hold a valid UCI license indicating nationality as Canadian.
- Sign, submit and comply with the CC National Team Agreement.
- Have completed all relevant UCI, WADA and Sport Integrity Canada anti-doping requirements.
- Have signed the consent form agreeing to be bound by the Universal Code of Conduct to prevent and address Maltreatment in Sport (UCCMS).
- Minors must have parental permission to participate in training programs and competitions.
- Have competed at the most recent Canadian Esports Championships or have an approved exemption per the Cycling Canada Canadian Championships Attendance Policy.

Additional eligibility requirements may be detailed in the Specific Selection Criteria below.

Selection criteria:	Athletes of each gender will be selected in the following order of priority until the quota is filled or there are no further athletes to be recommended: • Priority 1: The 2026 Elite Canadian Esports Champion • Priority 2: Athletes participating in the Cycling Canada Esports qualifier, in the order of ranking using the points scales in Appendix A One or more alternates may be named using the same criteria. <i>If fewer athletes meet the selection criteria than quota spots available in each category, or if a rider declines selection, Cycling Canada reserves the right to add athletes to the team, at its discretion.</i>	
Self-funding:	Athletes are responsible for any fees and costs as outlined in the Athlete Fees Policy published on the Cycling Canada website. These costs, if any, will be communicated to the athlete at the time of selection. All outstanding project fees must be paid prior to the beginning of the project.	



APPENDIX – CYCLING CANADA ESPORTS QUALIFIER POINTS SCALES

Cycling Canada is hosting an Esports Qualifier consisting of two events held on Aug. 23, 2025 at 12:00 pm EST.

The first will be held on the Toulouse Plains course (four laps of 7.5 km, 59 m of elevation gain per lap); the second will be held on the Tour de Corse course (two laps of 15.5 km, 140 m of elevation gain per lap).

Participants will be ranked based on points allocated to the finishers of each race as follows:

Finishing place	Points
1	25
2	18
3	15
4	12
5	10
6	8
7	6
8	4
9	2
10	1

Any ties will be broken by the athletes' finishing order in the second race.
